<p>RE: Pharmacist License of</p> <p><b>LISA DOORENBOS</b> License No. 16634 Respondent</p>	<p>CASE NO. 2020-0004</p> <p><b>COMBINED STATEMENT OF CHARGES, SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT, AND FINAL ORDER</b></p>
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**COME NOW** the Iowa Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) and Lisa Doorenbos (“Respondent”), 640 252<sup>nd</sup> Ave, Spirit Lake IA 51360, and enter into this Combined Statement of Charges, Settlement Agreement, and Final Order (“Order”) pursuant to Iowa Code sections 17A.10 and 272C.3(4), and 657 IAC 35.5. The Board has jurisdiction over Respondent and the subject matter of this case pursuant to Iowa Code chapters 17A, 147, 155A, and 272C, and 657 IAC chapter 36.

**A. STATEMENT OF CHARGES**

**COUNT I**

**PRACTICING WITHOUT CURRENT LICENSE**

1. Respondent is charged with practicing pharmacy without a current pharmacist license in violation of Iowa Code section 155A.7 and 657 IAC 2.11(2), and may be disciplined pursuant to Iowa Code sections 147.55(9) and 155A.12(1), and 657 IAC 36.6(22).

**COUNT II**

**FAILURE TO COMPLETE REQUIRED CPE**

2. Respondent is charged with failing to complete the continuing pharmacy education (CPE) required for license renewal in violation of 657 IAC 2.12, and may be disciplined pursuant to Iowa Code sections 147.55(9) and 155A.12(1), and 657 IAC 36.6(15).

**B. FACTUAL CIRCUMSTANCES**

3. Respondent’s pharmacist license number 16634 is currently active through June 30, 2021.
4. From July 2019 to December 2019, Respondent practiced pharmacy and served as pharmacist in charge without an active pharmacist license.
5. A review of Respondent’s CPE activities revealed she had insufficient CPE for her renewals in 2017 and 2019.

**C. SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER**

6. The Board has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this proceeding.

7. Respondent acknowledges that the allegations in the Statement of Charges, if proven in a contested case hearing, would constitute grounds for the discipline agreed to in this Order

8. Execution of this Order constitutes the resolution of a contested case. Respondent has a right to hearing before the Board on the charges, but Respondent waives the right to hearing and all attendant rights, including the right to appeal or seek judicial review of the Board's action, by freely and voluntarily entering into this Order. Once entered, this Order shall have the force and effect of a disciplinary order entered following a contested case hearing.

9. Respondent acknowledges that she has the right to be represented by counsel on this matter.

10. Respondent agrees that the State's counsel may present this Order to the Board and may have *ex parte* communications with the Board while presenting it.

11. This Order is subject to approval by a majority of the full Board. If the Board does not approve this Order, it shall be of no force or effect to either party, and shall not be admissible for any purpose in further proceedings in this matter. If the Board approves this Order, it shall be the full and final resolution of this matter.

12. This Order shall be part of Respondent's permanent record and shall be considered by the Board in determining the nature and severity of any disciplinary action to be imposed in the event of any future violations.

13. Respondent understands the Board is required by federal law to report any adverse action to the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's Disciplinary Clearinghouse and the National Practitioner Data Bank.

14. This Order, when fully executed, is a public record and is available for inspection and copying in accordance with the requirements of Iowa Code chapters 22 and 272C.

15. The Board's approval of this Order shall constitute a **FINAL ORDER** of the Board.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

16. Respondent is hereby **CITED** for practicing pharmacy without an active license and for failing to complete the required CPE and **WARNED** that Respondent's failure to comply with the laws governing the practice of pharmacy in the future could result in further discipline.

17. Within sixty (60) days, Respondent agrees to pay a **CIVIL PENALTY** in the amount of one-thousand dollars (\$1000). The check shall be made payable to the "Treasurer of Iowa" and shall be deposited in the general fund. The civil penalty should be mailed to the Iowa Board of Pharmacy, Attn: Amanda Woltz, 400 SW 8<sup>th</sup> St, Ste E, Des Moines IA 50309.


18. Within sixty (60) days, Respondent must complete seventy (70) hours of **CONTINUING PHARMACY EDUCATION** in accordance with the requirements of 657 IAC 2.12, which must

include fifty (50) hours related to drug therapy ("01" or "02"), four (4) hours related to patient or medication safety ("05"), two (2) hours related to immunization or vaccine administration ("06"), and fourteen (14) hours in any category. Respondent may utilize any CPE obtained after January 2, 2020 to satisfy this requirement. None of the hours used to fulfill this requirement can count towards the CPE required for the 2021 renewal of Respondent's pharmacist license. Respondent shall submit proof of completion of the CPE within sixty (60) days via email to [Amanda.woltz@iowa.gov](mailto:Amanda.woltz@iowa.gov). Respondent is responsible for all costs associated with obtaining the required CPE.

19. Should Respondent violate the terms of this Order, the Board may initiate action to impose other licensee discipline as authorized by Iowa Code chapters 147, 155A, and 272C and 657 IAC chapter 36.


