**COMBINED STATEMENT OF CHARGES,
SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT, AND FINAL
ORDER**

COME NOW the Iowa Board of Pharmacy ("Board") and Lauren Hughes, DVM, ("Respondent"), 6011 N Brady St, Davenport IA 52806, and enter into this Combined Statement of Charges, Settlement Agreement, and Final Order ("Order") pursuant to Iowa Code sections 17A.10, 124.305, and 272C.3(4). The Board has jurisdiction over Respondent pursuant to Iowa Code chapters 17A, 124, and 272C, and 657 IAC chapter 10.

A. STATEMENT OF CHARGES

COUNT I

FAILURE TO MAINTAIN REGISTRATION

1. Respondent is charged with failure to maintain registration pursuant to 657—Chapter 10, and may be disciplined pursuant to Iowa Code sections 124.303(1)(b) and 124.304(1)(d), and 657 IAC 10.10(1)"d", 10.10(2)"b" and 10.44(4).

B. FACTUAL CIRCUMSTANCES

2. Respondent holds Iowa Controlled Substances Act (CSA) registration number 1511962, which is currently active through October 31, 2021.

3. From November 2015 to October 2019, Respondent engaged in activities that require an active CSA registration without an active CSA registration.

C. SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER

4. The Board has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this proceeding.

5. Respondent acknowledges that the allegations in the Statement of Charges, if proven in a contested case hearing, would constitute grounds for the discipline agreed to in this Order.

6. Execution of this Order constitutes the resolution of a contested case. Respondent has a right to a hearing before the Board on the charges, but Respondent waives the right to hearing and all attendant rights, including the right to appeal or seek judicial review of the Board's action, by freely and voluntarily entering into this Order. Once entered, this Order shall have the force and effect of a disciplinary order entered following a contested case hearing.
