**COMBINED STATEMENT OF CHARGES,
SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT, AND FINAL
ORDER**

COME NOW the Iowa Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) and Gregory Judas (“Respondent”), 755 SE Gateway Dr #304, Grimes IA 50111, and enter into this Combined Statement of Charges, Settlement Agreement, and Final Order (“Order”) pursuant to Iowa Code sections 17A.10 and 272C.3(4), and 657 Iowa Administrative Code (IAC) 35.5. The Board has authority to take disciplinary action pursuant to Iowa Code sections 155A.6B(5) and 272C.3, and 657 IAC 36.

A. STATEMENT OF CHARGES

COUNT I

1. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 36.6(5) with being convicted of an offense that directly relates to the duties and responsibilities of the profession.

B. FACTUAL CIRCUMSTANCES

2. Respondent’s pharmacy support registration number 7861 is currently active through January 31, 2024.

3. Respondent was originally issued a pharmacy support registration through a Consent Agreement due to a conviction of theft 2nd degree in the Iowa District Court for Polk County on November 2, 2020. The Consent Agreement indicates that it will be considered by the Board in determining the nature and severity of any disciplinary action to be imposed in the event of any future violations.

4. On September 13, 2021, Respondent pled guilty to Mail Fraud in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1341 in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Iowa.

C. SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER

5. The Board has jurisdiction over Respondent and the subject matter of this proceeding.

6. Respondent acknowledges that the allegations in the Statement of Charges, if proven in a contested case hearing, would constitute grounds for the discipline agreed to in this Order.

7. Execution of this Order constitutes the resolution of a contested case. Respondent has a

right to hearing before the Board on the charges, but Respondent waives the right to hearing and all attendant rights, including the right to appeal or seek judicial review of the Board's action, by freely and voluntarily entering into this Order. Once entered, this Order shall have the force and effect of a disciplinary order entered following a contested case hearing.

8. Respondent acknowledges that they have the right to be represented by counsel on this matter.

9. Respondent agrees that the State's counsel may present this Order to the Board and may have *ex parte* communications with the Board while presenting it.

10. This Order is subject to approval by a majority of the full Board. If the Board does not approve this Order, it shall be of no force or effect to either party, and shall not be admissible for any purpose in further proceedings in this matter. If the Board approves this Order, it shall be the full and final resolution of this matter.

11. This Order shall be part of Respondent's permanent record and shall be considered by the Board in determining the nature and severity of any disciplinary action to be imposed in the event of any future violations.

12. Respondent understands the Board is required by federal law to report any adverse action to the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's Disciplinary Clearinghouse and the National Practitioner Data Bank.

13. This Order, when fully executed, is a public record and is available for inspection and copying in accordance with the requirements of Iowa Code chapters 22 and 272C.


14. The Board's approval of this Order shall constitute a **FINAL ORDER** of the Board.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

15. Respondent is hereby **CITED** for being convicted of an offense that directly relates to the duties and responsibilities of the profession and **WARNED** that future violations of the laws and rules governing pharmacy support persons can result in further disciplinary action.


16. Respondent is **RESTRICTED** from working in any pharmacy other than where he is currently employed. Respondent understands and agrees that, unless and until the restriction is lifted, the restriction will remain on his registration indefinitely. If Respondent seeks employment at a pharmacy through another employer while this restriction is in place, Respondent will be deemed to be in violation of this Order, and consents to his registration being immediately revoked, without further process or proceedings.
