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**STIPULATION
FOR ENTRY OF
CONSENT ORDER**

THE IOWA BOARD OF PHARMACY EXAMINERS (BOARD) AND JAMES BARTON BROWN, JR. (BROWN) STIPULATE TO THE FOLLOWING:

1. That Brown is currently licensed as a Licentiate in Pharmacy by the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, Certificate Number 12761, which expires on September 30, 1995; and
2. That Brown has applied to the Board for a Certificate of Licensure by submission of an Official Application for transfer of pharmaceutical licensure No. 9403334 from the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP); and
3. That between July 19, 1993, and November 1, 1994, Brown was employed part-time by the Iowa Methodist Medical Center as the sole clinical pharmacist in Iowa Methodist Medical Center's psychiatric department in Des Moines, Iowa, and was a faculty member of the Drake University College of Pharmacy. Brown's duties at Iowa Methodist Medical Center included evaluating patients, providing pharmaceutical care to patients, providing inservices to Iowa Methodist Medical Center's nursing staff, and other clinical pharmacist activities. Brown engaged in the practice of pharmacy in Iowa at

Iowa Methodist Medical Center's psychiatric department in Des Moines without an Iowa pharmacist license.

4. That upon issuance of a Certificate of Licensure by the Board, Brown consents to having his license to practice pharmacy in Iowa placed on probation for a period of time ending July 1, 1998; and

5. That during the probationary period, Brown will satisfy the following conditions:

a. Obey all federal and state laws and regulations substantially related to the practice of pharmacy.

b. Report to the Board or its designee quarterly. Said report shall be in writing. The report shall include the Respondent's place of employment, current address, and any further information deemed necessary by the Board from time to time.

c. Provide evidence of efforts to maintain skill and knowledge as a pharmacist through continuing education (CE) as directed by the Board.

d. Not supervise any registered intern and shall not serve as a preceptor; and

6. Should Respondent leave Iowa to practice pharmacy outside this State, Respondent shall notify the Board in writing of the dates of departure and return. Periods of practice outside the State shall not apply to reduction of the probationary period; and

7. Should Respondent leave Iowa to reside or practice in another state, he shall notify the Board in writing fourteen (14) days prior to his departure and within fourteen (14) days of his return. Periods of residency or practice outside the State of Iowa shall not apply to reduction of the probationary period.

8. Should Respondent violate probation in any respect, the Board, after giving Respondent notice and an opportunity to be heard, may revoke probation. If a petition to revoke probation is filed against Respondent during probation, the Board shall have continuing jurisdiction until the matter is final, and the period of probation shall be extended until the matter is final; and


9. That the Board retains the authority to bring an administrative action, pursuant to and in compliance with 1995 Iowa Code chapters 155A and 272C, to suspend, revoke, or deny the license of Brown in the event that any of the conditions of this Stipulation are violated; and

10. That the terms of this Stipulation shall be disclosed to the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) Disciplinary Clearinghouse; and

11. That this document shall be entered into a file designated "James Barton Brown, Jr." to be maintained by the Board in the normal course of its business activity.

12. This proposed Stipulation for Entry of Consent Order is subject to approval of a majority of the full Board. If the Board approves this Stipulation for Entry of Consent Order, it becomes the final disposition of this matter and the parties will be strictly bound by the terms set forth. If the Board fails to approve this Stipulation for Entry of Consent Order, it shall be of no force or effect to either party.

13. This Stipulation for Entry of Consent Order is accepted by Brown on the 14th day of February, 1995.


