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**COMES NOW**, the Complainant, Lloyd K. Jessen, and states:

1. He is the Executive Secretary/Director for the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners and files this Statement of Charges solely in his official capacity.
2. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code Chapters 155A and 272C (1999) & (2001).
3. On August 24, 2000, the Board renewed Respondent, Craig Decker's, pharmacy technician registration number 1148 to be registered as a pharmacy technician, subject to the laws of the State of Iowa and the rules of the Board.
4. Registration number 1148 is current and active until August 30, 2002.
5. Respondent's current address is 4509 47<sup>th</sup> Street, Des Moines, Iowa 50310.
6. Upon information and belief, Respondent is not currently employed as a pharmacy technician. Respondent was employed as a pharmacy technician at Central Iowa Compounding and its related pharmacy, Uptown Pharmacy, during most times relevant to this Statement of Charges. Central Iowa Compounding is currently located at, 2809 100<sup>th</sup> Street, Urbandale, Iowa 50322.

**COUNT I**


The Respondent is charged with performing tasks a pharmacy technician is not permitted to perform under Iowa Code section 155A.6(7) (1999) and 657 Iowa Administrative Code sections 22.18 & 22.12(1) for filling and dispensing prescriptions without first obtaining final verification of the prescription by a pharmacist.

**THE CIRCUMSTANCES**

1. While employed as a pharmacy technician at Central Iowa Compounding and Uptown Pharmacy, the Respondent compounded, filled, verified, and dispensed

prescriptions to his family members without obtaining final verification of these prescriptions by a pharmacist.

WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that a hearing be held in this matter and that the Board take such action as it may deem to be appropriate under the law.

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COME NOW the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners ("the Board") and Craig Decker, ("Respondent") and, pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 17A.10 and 272C.3(4) (2001), enter into the following Stipulation and Consent Order settling the contested case currently on file.

The licensee disciplinary hearing pending before the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners, on the allegations specified in the Statement of Charges filed against Respondent on January 30, 2001, shall be resolved without proceeding to hearing, as the parties have agreed to the following Stipulation and Consent Order:

1. That Respondent's pharmacy technician registration was renewed by the Board on August 24, 2000, as evidenced by Pharmacy Technician Registration Number 1148, which is recorded in the permanent records of the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners.
2. That Iowa Pharmacy Technician Registration Number 1148, issued to and held by Respondent is active and current until August 30, 2002.
3. Respondent is not currently employed as a pharmacy technician.

4. A Statement of Charges was filed against Respondent on January 30, 2001.
  5. That the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter herein.
  6. This Stipulation and Consent Order is entered into in order to resolve disputed claims and constitutes no admission on the part of the Respondent.
  7. Respondent's pharmacy technician registration is suspended for eighteen (18) months, beginning with the date of the Board's approval of this Stipulation and Consent Order.
  8. At the end of the period of suspension set forth in Paragraph 7, above, the Respondent may re-apply for a pharmacy technician registration pursuant to the laws and rules that govern registration of pharmacy technicians in the State of Iowa.
  9. The Respondent shall obey all federal and state laws, rules, and regulations substantially related to prescription drugs, controlled substances, or nonprescription drugs; with Iowa Code Chapters 124, 124A, 124B, 126, 147, and 205; and shall comply with the Board's rules.
  10. This Stipulation and Consent Order is the resolution of a contested case. By entering into this Stipulation and Consent Order, Respondent waives all rights to a contested case hearing on the allegations contained in the Statement of Charges, and waives any objections to this Stipulation and Consent Order.
  11. This proposed settlement is subject to approval by a majority of the full Board. If the Board fails to approve this settlement, it shall be of no force or effect to either

party. If the Board approves this Stipulation and Consent Order, it shall be the full and final resolution of this matter.

12. This proposed settlement is subject to approval by a majority of the full Board. If the Board fails to approve this settlement, it shall be of no force or effect to either party. If the Board approves this Stipulation and Consent Order, it shall be the full and final resolution of this matter.

13. The Board's approval of this Stipulation and Consent Order shall constitute a **FINAL ORDER** of the Board in a disciplinary action.

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14. This Stipulation and Consent Order is voluntarily submitted by Respondent to the Board for its consideration on the 13 day of April, 2001.






