COMES NOW the Iowa Board of Pharmacy (Board) and files this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges against Jennifer Kanselaar, 909 ½ Taylor St., Redfield, Iowa 50233, pursuant to Iowa Code sections 17A.12(2) and 17A.18(3). Respondent's Iowa certified technician registration number 4380 is currently active and expires on July 31, 2014.

A. TIME, PLACE, AND NATURE OF HEARING

Hearing. A disciplinary contested case hearing shall be held on January 13, 2014, before the Board. The hearing shall be held during the afternoon session beginning at 1:00 p.m. and shall be located in the Board conference room located at 400 S.W. 8th Street, Des Moines, Iowa.

Presiding Officer. The Board shall serve as presiding officer, but the Board may request an Administrative Law Judge from the Department of Inspections and Appeals make initial rulings on pre-hearing matters, and be present to assist and advise the Board at the hearing.

Hearing Procedures. The procedural rules governing the conduct of the hearing are found at 657 Iowa Administrative Code rule 35.19. At the hearing, you may appear personally or be represented by counsel at your own expense. You will be allowed the opportunity to respond to the charges against you, to produce evidence on your behalf on issues of material fact, cross-examine witnesses present at the hearing, and examine and respond to any documents introduced at the hearing. If you need to request an alternative time or date for the hearing, you must comply with the requirements in 657 Iowa Administrative Code rule 35.16. The hearing may be open to the public or closed to the public at your discretion.

Prosecution. The Office of Attorney General is responsible for representing the public interest (the State) in this proceeding. Copies of pleadings should be provided to counsel for the State at the following address:

Communications. You may contact the Board office at (515) 281-5944 with questions regarding this notice and other matters relating to these disciplinary proceedings. You may not contact individual Board members in any manner, including by phone, letter, or e-mail, regarding this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. Board members may only receive information about the case when all parties have notice and the opportunity to participate, such as at the hearing or in pleadings you file with the Board office and serve upon all parties in the case.

B. LEGAL AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION

Jurisdiction. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code chapters 147, 155A, and 272C (2013).

Legal Authority. If any of the allegations against you are founded, the Board has authority to take disciplinary action against you under Iowa Code chapters 147, 155A, and 272C (2013) and under 657 Iowa Administrative Code chapter 36.

Default. If you fail to appear at the hearing, the Board may enter a default decision or proceed with the hearing and render a decision in your absence, in accordance with Iowa Code section 17A.12(3) and 657 Iowa Administrative Code rule 35.21.

C. CHARGES

Count I

UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

Respondent is charged with unlawful possession of prescription drugs, including controlled substances, for other than lawful purposes, in violation of Iowa Code sections 124.401 and 155A.21(1), pursuant to Iowa Code section 155A.6A(5) and 657 Iowa Administrative Code rules 3.30(1), 36.1(4)(h), and 36.1(4)(j).

Count II

ENGAGING IN UNETHICAL BEHAVIOR

Respondent is charged with engaging in unethical behavior in violation of 657 Iowa Administrative Code rule 3.28(4), pursuant to Iowa Code section 155A.6A(5) and 657 Iowa Administrative Code rules 3.30(1), 36.1(4)(c), and 36.1(4)(u).

Count III

OBTAINING PRESCRIPTION DRUGS BY FRAUD

Respondent is charged with obtaining prescription drugs by fraud, in violation of Iowa Code section 155A.23(1), pursuant to Iowa Code section 155A.6A(5) and 657 Iowa Administrative Code rules 3.30(1), 36.1(4)(c), and 36.1(4)(j).

Count IV

MAKING FALSE ORAL PRESCRIPTIONS

Respondent is charged with making false oral prescriptions, in violation of Iowa Code section 155A.23(4), pursuant to Iowa Code section 155A.6A(5) and 657 Iowa Administrative Code rules 3.30(1), 36.1(4)(c), and 36.1(4)(j).

Count V

CONVICTION OF A FELONY RELATED TO THE PROFESSION

Respondent is charged with conviction of a felony related to the profession, pursuant to Iowa Code section 155A.6A(5) and 657 Iowa Administrative Code rules 3.30(1) and 36.1(4)(e).

D. FACTUAL CIRCUMSTANCES

1. Respondent holds Iowa certified technician registration number 4380, which is currently active and expires on July 31, 2014.
2. Respondent was employed as a technician at Wal-Mart Pharmacy 10-1764, 1001 73rd St., Des Moines, Iowa 50324.
3. On March 27, 2013, after investigation by Wal-Mart, Respondent admitted to diverting approximately 10,000 tablets of hydrocodone/APAP for personal use over a period of approximately one year.
4. Respondent admitted to entering prescription orders for oral prescriptions that were never called into the pharmacy using a fictitious patient name. The fraudulent prescriptions were picked up by Respondent under the fictitious name.
5. Respondent admitted to calling in a prescription for hydrocodone to another pharmacy for a fictitious patient. The prescription was cancelled by the pharmacy prior to dispensing any of the hydrocodone.
6. An audit by Wal-Mart revealed approximately 17,058 tablets of hydrocodone were diverted from the pharmacy.
7. On March 27, 2013, Respondent was terminated, arrested, and charged with five counts of felony possession of a controlled substance.
8. On July 3, 2013, Respondent pled guilty to five counts of obtaining or attempting to obtain a prescription drug by fraud.

E. SETTLEMENT

This matter may be resolved by settlement agreement. The procedural rules governing the Board's settlement process are found at 657 Iowa Administrative Code rule 36.6. If you are

F. FINDING OF PROBABLE CAUSE

On this 5th day of November, 2013, the Iowa Board of Pharmacy found probable cause to file this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges.



**SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND
FINAL ORDER**

Pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 17A.10 and 272C.3(4) (2013), the Iowa Board of Pharmacy ("Board") and Jennifer Kanselaar ("Respondent") enter into the following Settlement Agreement and Final Order ("Order") to settle a disciplinary proceeding currently pending before the Board.

The allegations contained in a Statement of Charges against Respondent shall be resolved without proceeding to hearing, as the Board and Respondent stipulate as follows:


1. Respondent holds Iowa Pharmacy Technician Registration No. 4380, which is currently active and expires on July 31, 2014.
2. The Board has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of these proceedings.
3. A Statement of Charges was filed against Respondent on November 5, 2013. A contested case hearing in this matter is scheduled for January 13, 2014.
4. Respondent has chosen not to contest the allegations in the Statement of Charges and acknowledges that the allegations, if proven in a contested case proceeding, would constitute grounds for discipline.
5. This Order is the resolution of a contested case. By entering into this Order, Respondent waives all rights to a contested case hearing on the allegations contained in the Statement of Charges, and waives any objections to this Order.
6. Respondent is freely and voluntarily entering into this Order.
7. Respondent acknowledges that she has a right to be represented by counsel on this matter.
8. The State's legal counsel may present this Order to the Board *ex parte*.
9. This Order is subject to approval by a majority of the full Board. If the Board fails to approve this Order, it shall be of no force or effect to either the Board or Respondent. If the Board approves this Order, it shall be the full and final resolution of this matter.
10. This Order shall be part of the permanent record of Respondent and shall be considered by the Board in determining the nature and severity of any disciplinary action to be imposed in the event of any future violations.

11. This Order, when fully executed, is a public record and is available for inspection and copying in accordance with the requirements of Iowa Code chapters 22 and 272C.
12. The Board's approval of this Settlement Agreement shall constitute a FINAL ORDER of the Board.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

13. Respondent agrees to **VOLUNTARILY SURRENDER** her pharmacy technician registration to resolve this matter.
14. This voluntary surrender is considered a revocation under 657 Iowa Administrative Code rule 36.15 for purposes of reinstatement. Respondent may not request reinstatement for at least three years from the date of this Order.
15. Respondent may request reinstatement of her Iowa pharmacy technician registration by filing an application for reinstatement under 657 Iowa Administrative Code rule 36.13. Respondent's registration shall not be reinstated except upon a showing by Respondent that the basis for suspension of her registration no longer exists, and that it is in the public interest for the registration to be reinstated.
16. Respondent agrees not to engage in any aspect of the practice of a pharmacy technician until such time as her registration is reinstated.
17. Should Respondent violate the terms of this Order, the Board may initiate action to impose other licensee discipline as authorized by Iowa Code chapters 272C and 155A (2013) and 657 Iowa Administrative Code chapter 36.

This Settlement Agreement and Final Order is voluntarily submitted by Respondent to the Board for its consideration on the 11 day of DEC, 2013
