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**COMES NOW**, the Complainant, Lloyd K. Jessen, and states:

1. He is the Executive Secretary/Director for the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners and files this Statement of Charges solely in his official capacity.
2. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code Chapters 155A and 272C (1997).
3. On July 27, 1984, Christian P. Lintner, the Respondent, was issued license number 16485 by the Board to engage in the practice of pharmacy, subject to the laws of the State of Iowa and the rules of the Board.
4. License number 16485 was current and active until June 30, 1998. A license renewal application was received from Respondent on July 2, 1998.
5. Respondent's current address is 4173 Highway 61, Red Wing, Minnesota 55066.
6. Respondent is not currently employed as a pharmacist.

**COUNT I**

The Respondent is charged with having had disciplinary action taken against his Minnesota pharmacist license by the Minnesota State Board of Pharmacy in violation of 1997 Iowa Code § 155A.12(8).

## THE CIRCUMSTANCES

1. On September 5, 1996, Respondent admitted to the theft of narcotics and the personal use of those narcotics from the pharmacy where he worked, More-4 Pharmacy, Red Wing, Minnesota.

2. Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of Minnesota was suspended for two (2) years by the Minnesota State Board of Pharmacy in January 1997. Respondent may request reinstatement of his Minnesota pharmacist license in January 1999.

3. Respondent did not report the Minnesota disciplinary action to the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners until July 2, 1998, when filing his Iowa pharmacist license renewal application.

WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that a hearing be held in this matter and that the Board take such action as it may deem to be appropriate under the law.

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**STIPULATION  
AND  
INFORMAL SETTLEMENT**

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COMES NOW the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners (the Board) and Christian P. Lintner (Respondent) and, pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 17A.10 and 272C.3(4) (1997), enter into the following Stipulation and Informal Settlement of the contested case currently on file:

1. Respondent was issued a license to practice pharmacy on the 27th day of July, 1984, by examination, as evidenced by license number 16485, which is recorded in the permanent records of the Board.
2. Iowa Pharmacist License Number 16485 issued to and held by Respondent is current and active until June 30, 2000.
3. Respondent is not currently employed as a pharmacist.
4. A Statement of Charges and Notice of Hearing was filed against Respondent on July 14, 1998.
5. The Board has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter herein.
6. Respondent does not contest the allegations set forth in the Statement of Charges and acknowledges that the allegations constitute grounds for the suspension of his license to practice pharmacy in Iowa.
7. Respondent's license to practice pharmacy is suspended indefinitely.

8. Respondent may apply for reinstatement on or after January 30, 1999, upon a showing of satisfaction of the terms of paragraph 9

9. Until Respondent's license is reinstated, he shall report to the Board in writing once every three (3) months. The reports shall be filed not later than September 5, December 5, March 5, and June 5 of each year. The reports shall include the Respondent's current status, including home address and telephone number; Respondent's progress in medical treatment and substance abuse rehabilitation; Respondent's compliance with the Stipulation and Order of the Minnesota Board of Pharmacy dated January 30, 1997; and Respondent's compliance with all applicable federal and state drug laws and criminal laws. Respondent's first report shall be filed with the Board not later than December 5, 1998.

10. Upon Respondent's application for reinstatement, the Respondent shall be scheduled for a formal or informal reinstatement conference with the Board or the Board's designee. Upon showing satisfaction of the above terms and the applicable requirements for reinstatement contained in 657 Iowa Administrative Code § 9.23, additional license conditions may be imposed or proposed by the Board for inclusion in a reinstatement order or supplemental informal settlement.

11. This Stipulation and Informal Settlement is subject to approval of a majority of the full Board. If the Board approves this Stipulation and Informal Settlement, it becomes the final disposition of this matter. If the Board fails to approve this Stipulation and Informal Settlement, it shall be of no force or effect to either party.

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12. This Stipulation and Informal Settlement is voluntarily submitted by the Respondent to the Board for its consideration on the 17th day of September, 1998.

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COME NOW the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners (“the Board”) and Christian P. Lintner, R.Ph. (“Respondent”) and, pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 17A.10 and 272C.3(4) (1999), enter into the following Amended Stipulation and Consent Order amending the Stipulation and Informal Settlement previously entered into by the Board and the Respondent settling the contested case filed by the Board against the Respondent on July 14, 1998:

The Stipulation and Informal Settlement entered into between the Board and the Respondent dated September 30, 1998 is hereby amended as follows:

1. That Respondent was issued a license to practice pharmacy in Iowa on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of July, 1984, by examination as evidenced by Pharmacist License Number 16485, which is recorded in the permanent records of the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners.
2. That Iowa Pharmacist License Number 16485, issued to and held by Respondent is on suspended status pursuant to the Stipulation and Informal Settlement dated September 30, 1998.

3. A Statement of Charges was filed against Respondent on July 14, 1998. The Statement of Charges was resolved by the Stipulation and Informal Settlement dated September 30, 1998 that was entered into by the Board and the Respondent.
4. That the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter herein.
5. Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in Iowa is reinstated, effective as of the date of the Board's approval of this Amended Stipulation and Consent Order.
6. Upon the date of the Board's approval of this Amended Stipulation and Consent Order, Respondent's license shall be placed on probation for a period of three year(s) under the following terms and conditions:
  - a. Respondent shall not consume alcohol.
  - b. Respondent shall not use any controlled substance or prescription drug in any form unless the controlled substance or prescription drug has been authorized and prescribed for Respondent by a licensed, treating physician or other qualified treating health care provider. The Respondent shall inform any treating physician or other treating health care provider of his medical history, including his history of chemical dependency. Respondent shall inform the Board in writing within ten days of the date he may be prescribed any prescription drug by a licensed practitioner, including the refill of any such drug.
  - c. Respondent shall provide witnessed blood or urine specimens on demand by an agent of the Board. The specimens shall be used for alcohol and

drug screening and to verify Respondent's compliance with any drug therapy ordered by Respondent's physician, all costs of which shall be paid by the Respondent. Respondent shall also agree to release the results of any laboratory screening conducted by the Minnesota Board of Pharmacy to the Board.

- d. Respondent shall comply with all treatment recommendations of his treatment program and his physician and/or counselor. The treatment program or physician/counselor shall submit quarterly reports to the Board documenting the Respondent's compliance with the treatment program.
- e. Respondent shall file written, sworn quarterly reports with the Board attesting his compliance with all the terms and conditions of this Stipulation and Consent Order. The reports shall be filed not later than March 5, June 5, September 5, and December 5 of each year of the Respondent's probation. The quarterly reports shall include the Respondent's place of employment, current home address, home telephone number, or work telephone number, and any further information deemed necessary by the Board from time to time.
- f. Respondent shall attend not less than eight meetings each month of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) or Narcotics Anonymous (NA) or any combination of AA or NA and other support groups approved by the Board which totals eight. The Respondent shall append to each quarterly report referred to in subparagraph 6(e) above, statements signed or

initialed by another person in attendance at the meetings attesting to the Respondent's attendance and continuing participation. The statement shall include the time, date, and location of the meetings attended.

- g. Respondent shall cause the Board to receive quarterly written reports from each of his employers, if any, who require licensure as a pharmacist as a condition of employment. After the first year of probation, Respondent shall cause the Board to receive said reports semiannually. The reports from Respondent's employer(s) shall address his work attendance record, his general work performance record, and shall describe any incidents which may constitute the violation of any part of this Order or the inappropriate practice of Pharmacy. The quarterly and semiannual reports shall be received at the Board office by the following dates: December 5, 1999; March 5, 2000, June 5, 2000, September 5, 2000, March 5, 2001; September 5, 2001, March 5, 2002, and September 5, 2002.
- h. Respondent shall make personal appearance before the Board or a Board committee upon request. The Respondent shall be given reasonable notice of the date, time, and location for such appearances.
- i. Respondent shall obey all federal and state laws and regulations substantially related to the practice of pharmacy and the distribution of controlled substances.
- j. Respondent shall provide evidence of efforts to maintain skill and knowledge as a pharmacist through continuing education (CE) as directed

by the Board.

- k. Respondent shall not own any pharmacy located in Iowa, shall not be the pharmacist-in-charge at any such pharmacy, shall not supervise any registered pharmacist-intern, and shall not perform any of the duties of a pharmacy preceptor.
- l. During probation, Respondent shall inform the Board in writing within ten (10) days of any change of home address, place of employment, home telephone number, or work telephone number.
- m. Respondent shall strictly abide by all terms of any remainder of the sentence imposed relative to the criminal charges against Respondent on November 16, 1996. If Respondent is on criminal probation at any time following the reinstatement of his license, he shall cause the Board to receive written notice of any change in the status of his criminal probation, including notice of any violation or the completion of probation, within thirty days of the occurrence.
- n. Respondent shall notify all present employers and prospective employers (no later than at the time of an interview), including the pharmacist-in-charge, of the resolution of this case and the terms, conditions, and restrictions imposed on Respondent by this document. Within thirty (30) days after approval of this Stipulation and Consent Order by the Board, and within fifteen (15) days of undertaking new employment as a pharmacist, Respondent shall cause his pharmacy employer and the

pharmacist-in-charge that he works under to report to the Board in writing acknowledging that the employer and the pharmacist-in-charge have read this document and understand it.

o. The Respondent shall obey all federal and state laws, rules, and regulations substantially related to the practice of pharmacy.


7. If during the period of probation Respondent fails to comply with any term, condition or requirement of this Order, engages in any act or omission substantially identical to any of those alleged in the Statement of Charges dated July 14, 1998, again pleads guilty to or is otherwise convicted of any crime related to the practice of pharmacy, or if he is for any reason rendered incapable of practicing pharmacy with reasonable skill and safety to the public, the Board may initiate action to revoke or suspend the Respondent's Iowa pharmacist license or to impose other licensee discipline as authorized by Iowa Code chapters 272C and 155A and 657 IAC 36.1. In its discretion, the Board may instead extend the period of probation and its associated requirements. During the period of suspension ordered under this part, Respondent shall not work in any pharmacy nor shall he prepare, package, compound, dispense or sell any drug, medicine, chemical or poison at any location in this state or supervise or assist another in doing so.
8. This Amended Stipulation and Consent Order is the resolution of the Respondent's informal request for reinstatement. By entering into this Stipulation and Consent Order, Respondent waives all rights to a contested case hearing on his informal request for reinstatement and waives any objections to this Amended Stipulation

and Consent Order.


9. This proposed Amended Stipulation and Consent Order is subject to approval by a majority of the full Board. If the Board fails to approve this settlement, it shall be of no force or effect to either party. If the Board approves this Stipulation and Consent Order, it shall be the full and final resolution of this matter.
10. The Board's approval of this Stipulation and Consent Order shall constitute a **FINAL ORDER** of the Board in a disciplinary action.


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11. This Stipulation and Consent Order is voluntarily submitted by Respondent to the Board for its consideration on the 27 day of August, 1999.
