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**STIPULATION
FOR ENTRY OF
CONSENT ORDER**

THE IOWA BOARD OF PHARMACY EXAMINERS (BOARD) AND
CANDACE F. RETTINGHAUS (Rettinghaus) STIPULATE TO THE FOLLOWING:

1. That Rettinghaus is not currently licensed as a Licentiate in Pharmacy by any State Board of Pharmacy; and
2. That Rettinghaus has applied to the Board for a Certificate of Licensure by submission of an application for original licensure by examination; and
3. That on July 19, 1997, Rettinghaus was arrested and charged with operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated in the state of Iowa. On January 12, 1998, Rettinghaus entered a plea of guilty in Polk County District Court to operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated.
4. That upon issuance of a Certificate of Licensure by the Board, Rettinghaus consents to having her license to practice pharmacy in Iowa placed on probation for a period of two (2) years; and
5. That during the probationary period, Rettinghaus will satisfy the following conditions:
 - a. Rettinghaus shall not consume alcohol.
 - b. Rettinghaus shall not use any controlled substance or prescription drug in any form unless the controlled substance or prescription drug has been authorized and

prescribed for Rettinghaus by a licensed, treating physician or other qualified treating health care provider.

c. Rettinghaus shall provide witnessed blood or urine specimens on demand by an agent of the Board. The specimens shall be used for alcohol and drug screening, all costs of which shall be paid by Rettinghaus.

d. Rettinghaus shall comply with any recommendations for medical treatment or rehabilitation, including follow-up to her guilty plea for operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated.

e. Rettinghaus shall file sworn quarterly reports with the Board attesting to her compliance with all the terms and conditions of this Consent Order. The reports shall be filed not later than September 5, December 5, March 5, and June 5 of each year of Rettinghaus' probation. The quarterly reports shall include Rettinghaus' place of employment, current address, information pertaining to the resolution of her OWI charge and subsequent guilty plea, and any further information deemed necessary by the Board from time to time. Rettinghaus' first quarterly report shall be due on March 5, 1998.

f. Rettinghaus shall obey all federal and state laws and regulations substantially related to the practice of pharmacy and the distribution of controlled substances.

g. Rettinghaus shall provide evidence of efforts to maintain skill and knowledge as a pharmacist through continuing education (CE) as directed by the Board.

h. Rettinghaus shall not supervise any registered intern and shall not perform any of the duties of a preceptor.

i. Rettinghaus shall notify all present and prospective employers of the resolution of this case and the terms, conditions, and restrictions imposed on Rettinghaus by this document. Within thirty (30) days after approval of this Consent Order by the Board, and within fifteen (15) days of undertaking new employment as a pharmacist,

Rettinghaus shall cause her pharmacy employer to report to the Board in writing acknowledging that the employer has read this document and understands it.

6. In the event Rettinghaus leaves Iowa to reside or to practice outside the state, Rettinghaus shall notify the Board in writing of the dates of departure and return. Periods of residence or practice outside Iowa will not apply to the duration of this Consent Order. However, evidence that Rettinghaus has failed to abide by the terms of subparagraphs 5-a or 5-b of this Consent Order while outside the state shall constitute a violation of this Consent Order.

7. Should Rettinghaus violate or fail to comply with any of the terms of conditions of this Consent Order, the Board may initiate action to revoke or suspend Rettinghaus' Iowa pharmacist license or to impose other licensee discipline as authorized in Iowa Code chapters 272C and 155A and 657 IAC 9.1.

8. Upon full compliance with the terms and conditions of this Consent Order and upon expiration of the period of probation, Rettinghaus' Iowa pharmacist license shall be restored to its full privileges free and clear of the terms of probation.

9. This Consent Order is subject to approval of a majority of the full Board. If the Board fails to approve this Consent Order, it shall be of no force or effect to either party.

10. The Board's approval of this Consent Order shall constitute a **FINAL ORDER** of the Board in a disciplinary action.

11. This Stipulation for Entry of Consent Order is voluntarily submitted by Rettinghaus to the Board for its consideration on the 30 day of January, 1998.
