COMES NOW, the Complainant, Lindy A. Pearson, and states:

1. She is the Chief Investigator for the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners and files this Statement of Charges solely in her official capacity.
2. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code Chapters 155A and 272C (1995).
3. On October 27, 1994, Ghazi M. Sinada, the Respondent, was issued license number 18325 by the Board to engage in the practice of pharmacy, subject to the laws of the State of Iowa and the rules of the Board.
4. License number 18325 is current and active until June 30, 1998.
5. Respondent currently resides at 121-H University Village, Ames, Iowa 50010.
6. Respondent was employed as a pharmacist by the Hamilton County Public Hospital, 800 Ohio Street, Webster City, Iowa 50595 from March 5, 1996, through June 14, 1996.

COUNT I

The Respondent is charged under Iowa Code Sections 155A.12(1), 155A.12(2), and 155A.12(3) (1995) and 657 Iowa Administrative Code Sections 9.1(4)(b), 9.1(4)(j), and 9.1(4)(u) with professional incompetency.

COUNT II


The Respondent is charged under Iowa Code Sections 155A.12(1), 155A.12(2), and 155A.12(3) (1995) and 657 Iowa Administrative Code Sections 8.5(1), 9.1(4)(c), 9.1(4)(j), and 9.1(4)(u) with making misleading, deceptive, untrue, or fraudulent representations in the practice of pharmacy.

THE CIRCUMSTANCES


1. Respondent's employment as a pharmacist at the Hamilton County Public Hospital was terminated on June 14, 1996, as a result of professional incompetency and moral turpitude.

2. Respondent has allegedly misrepresented his employment history as a pharmacist when applying for employment and when applying for transfer of pharmaceutical license.

WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that a hearing be held in this matter and that the Board take such action as it may deem to be appropriate under the law.

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**STIPULATION
AND
CONSENT ORDER**

On this 11th day of February, 1997, the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners and Ghazi M. Sinada, R.Ph., 3 Sunny Meadow Court, Apartment T2, Baltimore, Maryland 21209, each hereby agree with the other and stipulate as follows:

The licensee disciplinary hearing pending before the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners, on the allegations specified in the Statement of Charges filed against Respondent on September 16, 1996, shall be resolved without proceeding to hearing, as the parties have agreed to the following Stipulation and Consent Order:

1. That Respondent was issued a license to practice pharmacy on the 27th day of October, 1994, as evidenced by License Number 18325, which is recorded in the permanent records of the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners.
2. That Iowa Pharmacist License Number 18325 issued to and currently held by Respondent is current and active until June 30, 1998.
3. That a Statement of Charges was filed against Respondent on September 16, 1996.

4. That the Iowa Board of Pharmacy Examiners has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter herein.

5. The Respondent understands that there is no admission on his part of the truth of the allegations specified in the Complaint and Statement of Charges, but merely an agreement that the Board may treat the allegations as true solely for the purpose of this Stipulation and Consent Order. This Stipulation and Consent Order is executed as a compromise settlement of disputed claims.

SECTION I

Upon approval of this Stipulation and Consent Order by the Board, Respondent's license to practice pharmacy shall be placed on probation for one (1) year. During the probationary period the Respondent shall not supervise any registered intern and shall not perform any of the duties of a preceptor.

During the probationary period the Respondent shall complete three (3) continuing education courses or other formal, structured courses in the following areas: verbal communication skills using spoken English, interpersonal relations in the workplace, and drug therapy. Each course shall be *not less than* eight (8) hours in length and shall be pre-approved by the Board. Documentation of successful completion of each course shall be submitted to the Board. These courses are in addition to the thirty (30) hours of continuing education required for license renewal.

In addition, during the probationary period the Respondent shall:

1. Inform the Board in writing within ten (10) days of any change of home address, place of employment, home telephone number, or work telephone number.
2. Provide evidence of efforts to maintain skill and knowledge as a pharmacist through continuing pharmacy education (CPE) as directed by the Board.

3. Obey all federal and state laws, rules, and regulations substantially related to the practice of pharmacy and the distribution of controlled substances.

4. Notify all present and prospective employers of the resolution of this case and the terms, conditions, and restrictions imposed on Respondent by this document. Within thirty (30) days after approval of this Stipulation and Consent Order by the Board, and within fifteen (15) days of Respondent undertaking new employment, Respondent shall cause his employer to report to the Board in writing acknowledging the employer has read this document.

SECTION II

1. Should Respondent leave Iowa to reside or practice in another state, he shall notify the Board in writing fourteen (14) days prior to his departure and within fourteen (14) days of his return.

2. Respondent shall fully and promptly comply with all Orders of the Board and the statutes and rules regulating the practice of pharmacy in Iowa. Any violation of the terms of this Order is grounds for further disciplinary action, upon notice and opportunity for hearing, for failure to comply with an Order of the Board, in accordance with Iowa Code section 272C.3(2)(a).

3. Should Respondent violate probation in any respect, the Board, after giving Respondent notice and an opportunity to be heard, may revoke probation and impose additional disciplinary sanctions, including the revocation of Respondent's license to practice pharmacy. If a petition to revoke probation is filed against Respondent during probation, the Board shall have continuing jurisdiction until the matter is final, and the period of probation shall be extended until the matter is final.

4. Upon successful completion of probation, Respondent's certificate will be fully restored.


5. This Stipulation and Consent Order is subject to approval of a majority of the full Board. If the Board approves this Stipulation and Consent Order, it becomes the final disposition of this matter. If the Board fails to approve this Stipulation and Consent Order, it shall be of no force or effect to either party.

6. This Stipulation and Consent Order is voluntarily submitted by Respondent to the Board for its consideration on the 27 day of JANUARY, 1997.
